THE STRESS OF INDETERMINACY WHEN UNDER ATTACK

Unanticipated, unrehearsed, and caught off guard you are under violent and physical attack. Absence of experiences learned through tactical or strategic training, paralysis of mind and body may be the consequence and beyond one's control, consequently leading to lack of quick decision making and acquiescing to the circumstances of the situation. Knowing how to effectively respond to a situation is the result of quality and discriminating training, providing for the ability to expediently gain a de-As you read this I know what you are thinking, I know how to handle myself. Unfortunately, we tend to exaggerate our abilities which fosters optimistic overconfidence or should I say, "cognitive bias." Without the perspicacious (streetwise) or mental training there is a deep vein of uncertainty running through your mind and body. Suddenly the cortical levels jump when the brain senses uncertainty. This can inhibit rational decision making. Without thoroughly understanding what is occurring everything about the situation is atypical and makes the defender flustered and decomposed causing indiscretion. Under the enormous pressure of attack, the proper format you choreographic, (proper stance, proper grip, correct sight picture, correct placement of finger on the trigger) becomes uncoupled or divorced, and totally decompartmentalized. Unfortunately, due to the un-disciplined situation and the fluid circumstances, uncertainty is the mantra. You are responding to variables you have never been exposed to. You have the tools in your toolkit, but, do you have the mental framework for problem-solving and execution or have you entered, "the experiential mode of thinking"?

How do we overcome this puzzling and unconstitutional situation? Response to any attack rests on integrated predictive analytics based on a strong learning foundation. Remember the anticipated moves become uncontrollable variables based on your opposition's performance. Threats are an un-disciplined entity with no regard for life. Many of these threats live in an environment where death is not the result of old age. Mistaken thinking can bring the situation to a calamitous event, especially one occurring suddenly and causing great loss of innocent lives through incorrect action. Decision making is the resultant framework of contiguous training and experience. As the situation rapidly unfolds and information is incorporated, speed and accuracy, as well as intuition, plays a vital role and becomes the advantage in lieu of a disadvantage. Training which is archived is the thread linking all the variables and uncertainty for a successful outcome. Shots you have ever made and all shots you've ever archived through insightful training will be delivered successfully. You will feed off your training experiences. It's all in the preparation which is decision making, force escalation and force-on-force which are the three relevant areas of firearms training. Marksmanship at this point becomes meaningless.

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ACTION PISTOL

USPSA is the first Tuesday of the month. United States Practical Shooting Association. We usually run for stages. There is a 32 round field course, a 16 round medium course or speed shoot stage and two 8 round short courses. More information can be found at USPSA.org. IDPA is the second and fourth Tuesday of the month. In all of the shooting sports, there are divisions, which are the type of gun used, and classes, which are the skill level of the shooter. In IDPA, International Defensive Pistol Association, class is determined by shooting a classifier match which is a three stage match with set target and shooting position dimensions. No matter where in the world an IDPA classifier is shot, it will be set up the same way. The score of the classifier determines the shooter's class. IDPA requires shooters to shoot the classifier at least once per year but we run the classifier every month at Hellertown. The IDPA classifier is three 24 round stages.

ICORE, the International Confederation of Revolver Enthusiasts, matches are on the Friday after the general club meeting. This is usually the third Friday of the month. We run four or five stages for ICORE with a match count of 100 to 150 rounds. In USPSA and ICORE there are dozens of classifier stages and at least one classifier is required per match. Just as in IDPA, shooter class, or skill, is determined by the results of the classifiers. The regular monthly IDPA match is on the fourth Tuesday of the month. There are four stages and the round count is 40 to 80 rounds for the match. IDPA stages are meant to simulate real life situations in which a concealed carry permit holder would have to defend themselves. We sometimes shoot in the dark with flashlights. If there is a fifth Tuesday, we run something different such as a pistol caliber carbine match, a 22 rimfire match, a pocket gun match or a falling plate match with Newbold Targets, indoor range safe, polymer targets.
