Affecting Your Safety - Influencing Factors

Look around and observe the number of people who live by and on their phones. As they walk, shop, drive, eat in restaurants, in meetings, and general conversation, you name it they are connected with their phones just like the umbilical cord to unborn child. Without being present in your environment and not connected to your surroundings you have no domination or command over your circumstances, conditions or the aggregate of social influence affecting your life, if you come under attack. By being in a state of preoccupation, the obsession with your phone, creates a failure of attentiveness. Being fused to your cell phone you become unmindful, without awareness, sensation, perception, judgement, reasoning or volitional processes. Absent of your environment makes you a prime selection for attack.

Within today's environment we need to be sensitive to our surroundings, by that I mean the ability of awareness, connecting to and perceiving potential dangers. When we are attentive, we are able to perform when attacked without thought. This is known as "intense concentration and focus" which greatly improves a person's performance in physical and mental action, function, or sphere of action in order to be successful. We need that ability to be able to connect to and feel the plausibility of attacker(s) intentions and actions, able to respond to acts of violence.

Opposite of being aware of yourself and others, including the aggregate of your surroundings, emotionally you will be overwhelmed and unable to respond with effectiveness under attack creating a state of being mentally clutched, producing tunnel vision, becoming unfastened, absent of breath, potentially freezing or behaving in an unrestrained or dissolute way, doing things that you never intended, making mistakes, being panicky, and trying to think of what to do, instead of doing, a state of hypomnesia (the inability to remember how to perform with competence). At this point you have no control or command, over your attacker(s). Attacker(s) can change strategies at any moment. By being aware of your environment and connecting with your surroundings automatically if there is a change of strategies by your attacker(s) you will be able to adapt quickly and effectively.

Unfortunately, under attack we don't have enough time to make conscious decisions, where we have adequate time to evaluate all available information looking for various options defining the objectives and making a decision. Through scenario base training and along with component training, we are training our minds to process information quickly, accurately and without errors or faults in our subconscious, becoming instantly available when needed.

To avoid potential apocalyptic situations an acronym to remember every time you exit your car or enter a location is SIPDE from the Motorcycle Safety Foundation.

- S -Scan aggressively in all four directions
- I -Identify potential hazards
- P -Predict what the hazard will do
- D -Decide what you should do and how you will do it
- E -Execute the maneuver

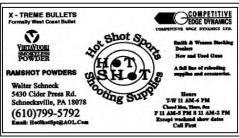
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Geyer's Corner
